- Advanced Art
- > 6th grade and up (Students in 8th grade and up will receive 1 credit towards HS graduation requirements.)
- > Instructor: Mrs. Estrada
- > Thursdays from 3:30 4:30 pm
- \$320 per year, plus a one-time \$50 supply fee

Students will use a multitude of mediums to create advanced art pieces that will be cherished for years to come! Students will study and complete line drawing, doodle drawing, macrame, pixel art, deco art, abstract painting, air dry clay, paper mâché, landscape portraits, and more!

- Arts & Crafts
- Kindergarten through 5th grade
- > Instructor: Mrs. Blick
- > Thursdays from 3:30 4:30 pm

Students will create a different art project each class using a variety of artistic mediums. Projects will be centered around a theme or upcoming holiday. Students of all artistic abilities will have fun in this class! All supplies will be provided.

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Students are taught American Sign Language (ASL) vocabulary and grammatical structures in a full inclusion. They will learn ASL fingerspelling, the use of gestural devices, and how to appropriately use the signing space. Students will learn about the deaf culture in the United States.

Love chess? Join *Chess Masters* to play, learn, strategize, and spend time with friends. All chess equipment will be provided. Attendees will be engaged in playing chess with different players. Results will be tracked each week and player scores will be posted. Players will sometimes be able to select their opponent and other days they will be assigned by rankings. Timers will be introduced this year and students will be taught their proper use. Beginners are always welcome and will be introduced to learn the basics of chess and to participate in competitive games. Beginners will not be ranked until they feel confident in their skills.

- Cooking & Kitchen Skills
- \rightarrow 1st 6th grade
- > Instructor: Mrs. Richardson
- Wednesdays from 3:30 4:30 pm
- \$320 per year, plus a one-time \$60 supply fee
- **Requirement**: Each student must provide a full-sized apron that will stay at school.

Students will be introduced to the fundamentals of cooking in a fun and safe environment. Our young chefs will learn essential skills such as measuring ingredients, following simple recipes, basic knife safety, and proper food handling. This class involves hands-on activities where children can prepare a variety of foods including breakfast options, sides, appetizers, and desserts. Emphasis is placed on healthy eating habits, teamwork, and gaining confidence in the kitchen.

- Crochet Club
- 4th grade and up
- > Instructor: Mrs. Estrada
- > Thursdays from 3:30 4:30 pm
- > Free class with a one-time \$50 supply fee (includes one needle kit per student)
- **Requirement:** choices of yarn (more information will be provided at the first club meeting)

This is a free, after-school club for students of all abilities in grades 4th and up to learn how to crochet. Students will learn the various crochet styles while using a variety of yarns. Projects will include hats, blankets, scarves, gloves, and stuffed animals. Along with making and donating preemie hats to Cook Children's Hospital, students will also display their handmade creations at the annual art show.

- > Intro. to Barbering & Cosmetology
- > 7th grade and up
- > Instructor: Ms. Smith
- → Mondays from 3:30 4:30 pm
- > \$320 per year, plus a one-time \$50 supply fee

Intro. to Barbering and Cosmetology will cover basic skills in the beauty and barbering industry. Students will learn about different professions within the industry, proper sanitation of all equipment, and how to perform a scalp analysis. We will learn and practice how to cut, style, and color hair to a basic level. Students will learn how to cut and style a fade. This course will also cover skin care and massage techniques. The ultimate goal of this course is to help students gain experience before pursuing a career in this field.

- Musical Theatre

This is a student-led class where they will work together to create and produce an end-of-year musical. Students will have the choice of acting in the musical, playing an instrument, or creating costumes and set design. - > \$320 per year, per class (choice of Mondays or Wednesdays)

Snapology provides a safe, fun environment for children to learn and create. All activities embody S.T.E.A.M. (science, technology, engineering, art, math)! Students will use Legos, Duplos, K'Nex Models to encourage active designing, creativity, and inventive learning. The activities challenge participants to cultivate problem solving skills through application of the scientific method and project planning.
